Throughout the Environmental Analysis

The EA makes references to the “temporary system of approximately two miles of groomed trails near Wanoga Sno-play” that is open to skiing with dogs. These references would be more accurately stated as the “temporary groomed trail, approximately two miles long, near Wanoga Sno-play”.
