

Chelan –Graham Harbor Campground

Description: This is a boat in campsite along Lake Chelan. Scattered invasive plants are present in the areas of ground disturbance associated with the campsites.

Infested acres: trace (less than .1 acre)

Total acres: 5 acres

5th Field watershed: Upper Lake Chelan HUC #1702000902

Major Streams and Waterbodies: Lake Chelan, Domke Creek

Elevation: 1200-1300 ft.

Vegetation Type: grand fir, Douglas fir, low elevation grassland.

Soils: Sandy Loam

Precipitation: 12-14"/yr

Special Management Areas: None.

Recreation: Boat-in camping.

Grazing: None.

TES, ISSSP Species: None.

Other land Ownerships: None

Vectors of spread: Human – foot travel, wildlife, wind.

Ongoing treatments: Invasive plants are currently spot sprayed or hand-pulled, depending on the species.

Existing NEPA:

IWM Strategy: Eradicate invasive plants from this small, isolated campsite to prevent spread to adjacent, un-roaded areas. Use spot spraying with herbicide and follow up with hand pulling. Monitor for new invaders, seed with native grasses.
